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What is a real man?

These days, if a man has any sense of Godliness he is homophobic, intolerant and/or brainwashed by the evil "right wing". Think of the shows you have watched through the years that have demonstrated this point. Even The Flintstones is guilty of de-masculating the role of husbands and men through the portrayal of selfish simpletons such as Fred and Barney.

The ironic truth is, while Hollywood portrays the perfect man as a lean, muscular (1 Tim 4:8), athletic, multi-talented, rich business (Mat 19:23-24) owner or CEO type who sails on the weekends, dines in fine restaurants, and flies coast to coast during the week using a credit card that never ends, the single women that are past thirty-five and have two children out of wedlock or a busted marriage are starting their lives all over again in search of an ordinary looking man that will hold a moderate job (Pr. 22:2), come home after work, dine at the local pizza or barbeque spot, and love her children like she does. Tabloids and soaps just don't get it, so they continue in their fantasy world only to deceive young gullible women into believing lies about men and relationships.
